Philip Arkinstall has been the associate principal clarinettist with Melbourne Symphony Orchestra since 2008 and was the principal clarinettist with the Malaysian Philharmonic Orchestra from its inception in 1998 until 2009. He has been guest principal for every major Australian orchestra and chamber orchestra and has toured Europe and South America with Camerata Bern. He won the 2MBS-FM radio competition in 1996 and was the ABC's Young Performer of the Year in 1997 amongst numerous other awards.

He has appeared as a soloist with all the major Australian orchestras and on numerous occasions with the MPO in repertoire ranging from Mozart, Copland and Strauss to Henze and Stravinsky.

Reviewers have described his playing as 'Mellifluous, engaging and assured'.

Philip teaches clarinet for Melbourne University and has given masterclasses throughout Asia and South America. He is a founder of Plexus, a group formed with pianist Stefan Cassomenos and violinist Monica Curro, that has commissioned over 100 new works since 2014, mostly from Australians, and already premiered 50 of these with many more to come in 2016 and beyond.
